From the Ogle Office

Dear Friends and Parishioners:

We have all lived through a year like no other: the Year of the Pandemic; the Year of Covid 19; a year we would all very much like to leave behind and forget as soon as possible, along with all its "PPE"—that "personal protective equipment" and behavior, that paradoxically both helps us and yet oppresses us.

The masks, the distance, the disinfectant—we long for the day when we can return to "normal", with faces bared, embracing freely and sharing life fully, in all its glorious grime. The masks, distance and constant disinfectant are NOT normal for us humans whom the Lord created to be seen, to be held, to be immersed in the clean healthy soil that makes seeds sprout and life grow.

Yet it is true that we are all infected with something even more virulent than Covid, which is: sin and its effects—darkened intellect, weakened will, and self-centeredness--- in other words, the damaging of the true nature we were created with: the image of God on our souls.

That is why we have the instinct to protect our sorry selves with what we might call spiritual masks, spiritual distance and spiritual disinfectants, even though they merely disguise what we sense we lack; like putting "lipstick on a pig", as the old saying goes. What are these fake spiritual PPEs?

Because our intellect is darkened we cannot understand easily how God really created us for eternity. We think we can live for what is material and sensible goods only. We mask the unseen eternal reality which lies just beneath the surface of every moment and every soul. We mask the true eternal reward that God created us for.

Because our will is weakened, we are afraid to come close to the God who longs for us, whom the Chosen People at Mount Sinai feared because they only perceived a "blazing fire, darkness, gloom and storm" as the letter to the Hebrews, chapter 12, says. The little that we do understand of God seems to be too difficult for us really to embrace, so we keep our distance from Him, to our eternal detriment.

And because our sinful inclinations tend to make us self-centered rather than loving and giving, we try to "disinfect" our lives with the aura of respectability, with human respect, with the evanescent perfume of fleeting beauty and self-importance. The only true disinfectant for the human soul is a virtuous, self-sacrificial character, in imitation of the One who made us in His own image, such as Baruch praises in the third reading.

The Gospel of the resurrection offers us a remedy for all those fake "PPE's" that we use to camouflage sin's effects on our lives.

The risen Christ became incarnate in the first place not merely as a friendly gesture or to teach us good moral behavior. Rather, he was born in order to suffer, die and rise again, in order to engage in a new act of Creation, such as tonight's first reading narrated, to give us a second chance at what Adam and Eve threw away.

Christ gave us in his resurrection a new Covenant to replace that of the Chosen People that we heard in the second reading. He replaced it with the New Covenant of His Body and Blood, the new Paschal Mystery that leads us through the Red Sea of sin and distance into the Promised Land of intimate and eternal life with our Creator, through baptism as St Paul says in tonight's Epistle, the same Baptism that we will celebrate in a few minutes with Helen, Cindy, Kristina and Jenny.

At the tomb early on that first Easter Morning, there was no longer the mask of hiding the eternal aspect of life; for the stone was rolled away to reveal the empty tomb of God's infinity and eternity.

Instead of keeping our distance from God, we have the angel at the tomb telling the women and us how to find and follow Jesus: in the Galilee of personal closeness to him and mutual indwelling of the Holy Spirit in us.

Instead of the disinfectant of passing pleasures, the women of Easter morning bring the true perfume and spices.... of devotion, of service and of accepting the mission to spread the Good News of God's undying love that gives us eternal life—a new Creation, a new covenant, and a new way of life. Let us, my friends, strive to do the same.

De El Pastor

Queridos Amigos y Feligreses:

Todos hemos vivido un año como ningún otro: el año de la pandemia; el año del Covid 19; un año que a todos nos gustaría mucho dejar atrás y olvidar lo antes posible, junto con todo su "EPP", ese "equipo de protección personal" y ese comportamiento, que paradójicamente nos ayuda y, sin embargo, nos oprime.

Las máscaras, la distancia, el desinfectante, anhelamos el día en que podamos volver a la "normalidad", con los rostros descubiertos, abrazándonos libremente y compartiendo la vida plenamente, en toda su gloriosa mugre. Las máscaras, la distancia y el desinfectante NO son normales para nosotros los seres humanos a quienes el Señor creó para ser vistos, para ser sostenidos, para ser sumergidos en la tierra limpia y saludable que hace que las semillas broten y la vida crezca.

Sin embargo, es cierto que todos estamos infectados con algo aún más virulento que Covid, que es el pecado y sus efectos: intelecto oscurecido, voluntad debilitada y egocentrismo, en otras palabras, el daño de la verdadera naturaleza en la que fuimos creados con, que es: la imagen de Dios en nuestras almas.

Es por eso que tenemos el instinto de protegernos a nosotros mismos con lo que podríamos llamar máscaras espirituales, distancia espiritual y desinfectantes espirituales, aunque simplemente disfrazan lo que sentimos que nos falta; como ponerle "*pintalabios a un cerdo*", como dice el viejo refrán. ¿Qué son estas protecciones (PPE) espirituales falsos?

Debido a que nuestro intelecto está oscurecido, no podemos entender fácilmente cómo Dios realmente nos creó para la eternidad. Creemos que podemos vivir solo para lo que son bienes materiales y sensibles. Enmascaramos la realidad eterna invisible que se encuentra justo debajo de la superficie de cada momento y cada alma. Enmascaramos la verdadera recompensa eterna para la que Dios nos creó.

Debido a que nuestra voluntad está debilitada, tenemos miedo de acercarnos al Dios que nos anhela, a quien el Pueblo Elegido en el Monte Sinaí temía porque solo percibían un "*fuego ardiente, tinieblas, tinieblas y tormentas*" como la carta a los hebreos, capítulo 12, dice. Lo poco que entendemos de Dios parece ser demasiado difícil de abrazar realmente, así que mantenemos nuestra distancia de Él, en nuestro detrimento eterno.

Y debido a que nuestras inclinaciones pecaminosas tienden a hacernos egocéntricos en lugar de amar y dar, tratamos de "desinfectar" nuestras vidas con el aura de respetabilidad, con respeto humano, con el perfume de la belleza fugaz y la importancia personal. El único desinfectante verdadero para el alma humana es un carácter virtuoso y abnegado, a imitación de Aquel que nos hizo a Su propia imagen, como elogia Baruc en la tercera lectura.

El Evangelio de la resurrección nos ofrece un remedio para todos esos protecciones "PPE" falsos que usamos para camuflar los efectos del pecado en nuestras vidas.

El Cristo resucitado se encarnó en primer lugar no solo como un gesto amistoso o para enseñarnos un buen comportamiento moral. Más bien, nació para sufrir, morir y resucitar, para participar en un nuevo acto de Creación, como lo narra la primera lectura de esta noche, para darnos una segunda oportunidad de lo que Adán y Eva arrojaron.

Cristo nos dio en su resurrección una nueva Alianza para reemplazar la del Pueblo Elegido que escuchamos en la segunda lectura. Lo reemplazó con la Nueva Alianza de Su Cuerpo y Sangre, el nuevo Misterio Pascual que nos lleva a través del Mar Rojo del pecado y la distancia a la Tierra Prometida de la vida íntima y eterna con nuestro Creador, a través del bautismo, como dice San Pablo en la Epístola de esta noche, y que vamos a celebrar en un poco con Jenny, Helena, Cindy, y Kristina.

En la tumba temprano en esa primera Mañana de Pascua, ya no existía la máscara que ocultaba el aspecto eterno de la vida; porque la piedra fue removida para revelar la tumba vacía del infinito y la eternidad de Dios.

En lugar de mantenernos alejados de Dios, tenemos al ángel en la tumba diciéndonos a las mujeres y a nosotros cómo encontrar y seguir a Jesús: en la Galilea de la cercanía personal con él y la morada mutua del Espíritu Santo en nosotros.

En lugar del desinfectante de los placeres pasajeros, las mujeres traen el verdadero perfume y las especias de la devoción, del servicio y de la aceptación de la misión de difundir la Buena Nueva del amor eterno de Dios que nos da la vida eterna: una nueva creación, una nueva alianza y una nueva manera de vida. Vamos, amigos míos, a esforzarnos por hacer lo mismo.

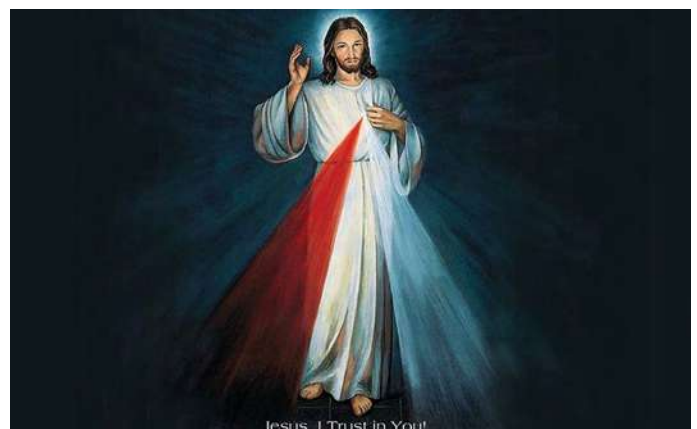

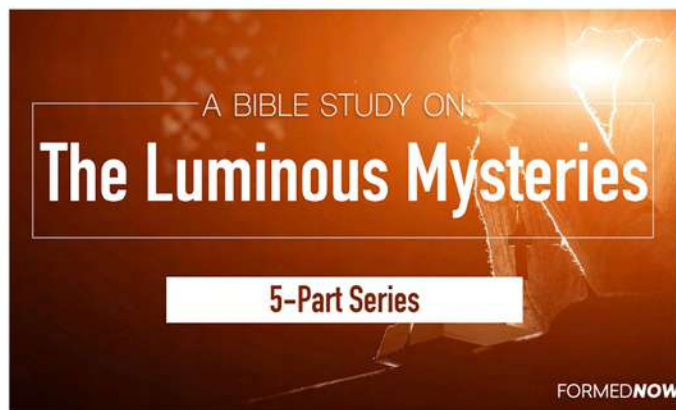

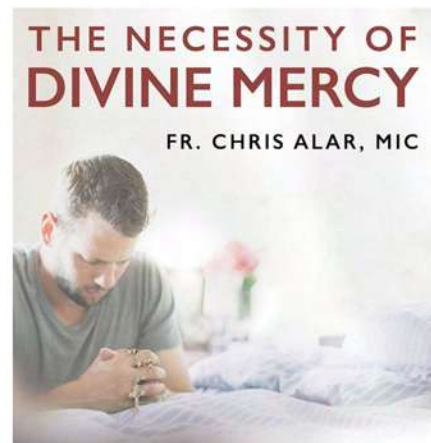
