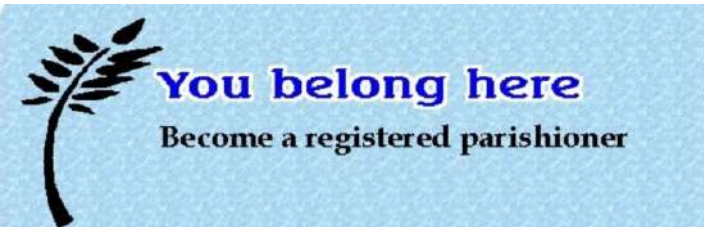

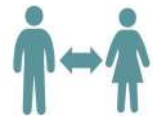
WASH YOUR HANDS

FROM THE OGLE OFFICE

Dear Friends and Parishioners:

Holy Family Sunday always occurs on the Sunday between Christmas Day and New Years Day, except when those days occurs on Sunday, when it moves to a weekday. There is no question that the understanding of family is under attack in our times, not merely in regard to the functions which may be carried out by a specific family member (which can certainly be adjusted), but in the very vision of the family as a divinely-ordained institution for the birth and nurturing of children, and the growth in holiness of the husband and wife. Let us learn from the wisdom of Pope Francis in his Angelus address on Holy Family Sunday in 2019.

Dear brothers and sisters, good morning!

And truly, today is a beautiful day... We celebrate today the feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth. The term "holy" places this family within the sphere of holiness which is a gift from God but, at the same time, is free and responsible adherence to God's plan. This was the case for the family of Nazareth: they were totally available to God's will.

How can we not wonder, for example, at Mary's docility to the action of the Holy Spirit Who asks her to become the mother of the Messiah? Because Mary, like every young woman of her time, was about to realize her life project, that is, to marry Joseph.

But when she realizes that God is calling her to a particular mission, she does not hesitate to proclaim herself His "servant" (cf. *Lk 1: 38*). Jesus will exalt her greatness not so much for her role as a mother, but for her obedience to God. Jesus said: "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it" (*Lk 11: 28*), like Mary. And when she does not fully understand the events that involve her, Mary meditates in silence, reflects and adores the divine initiative. Her presence at the foot of the cross consecrates this total willingness.

Then, with regard to Joseph, the Gospel does not give us a single word: he does not speak, but he acts, obeying. He is the man of silence, the man of obedience.

Today's Gospel reading (cf. *Mt 2: 13-15, 19-23*) recalls this obedience of the righteous Joseph three times, referring to the flight to Egypt and the return to the land of Israel. Under God's guidance, represented by the Angel, Joseph distances his family from Herod's threats, and saves them. The Holy Family is thus in solidarity with all the families of the world forced into exile, in solidarity with all those who are compelled to abandon their own land due to repression, violence, and war.

Finally, the third person of the Holy Family, Jesus. He is the will of the Father: in Him, says Saint Paul, there was no "yes" and "no", but only "yes" (cf. *2 Cor 1: 19*). And this is made manifest in many moments of His earthly life. For example, the episode at the temple when He responded to the anguished parents who sought Him out: "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (*Lk 2: 49*); His continual repetition: "My food is to do the will of Him Who sent me and to accomplish His work" (*Jn 4: 34*); His prayer in the olive grove: "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, Your will be done" (*Mt 26: 42*). All these events are the perfect realization of the very words of Christ Who says: "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired [...] Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book'" (*Heb 10: 5-7; Psalm 40: 7-9*).

Mary, Joseph, Jesus: the Holy Family of Nazareth which represents a choral response to the will of the Father: the three members of this family help each other reciprocally to discover God's plan. They prayed, worked, communicated. And I ask myself: you, in your family, do you know how to communicate or are you like those kids at the table, each one with their mobile phone, while they are chatting? In that table there seems to be a silence as if they were at Mass... But they do not communicate between themselves. We must resume dialogue in the family: fathers, parents, sons, grandparents and siblings must communicate with one another ... This is today's homework, right on the day of the Holy Family. May the Holy Family be a model for our families, so that parents and children may support each other mutually in adherence to the Gospel, the basis of the holiness of the family.

Let us entrust to Mary, "Queen of the Family", all the families in the world, especially those who suffer or who are in distress, and invoke upon them her maternal protection.

DE LA OFICINA DEL PASTOR

El Domingo de la Sagrada Familia siempre ocurre el domingo entre el día de Navidad y el día de Año Nuevo, excepto cuando esos días ocurren en domingo, cuando se traslada a un día laborable. No hay duda de que la comprensión de la familia está siendo atacada en nuestro tiempo, no solo en lo que respecta a las funciones que puede realizar un miembro concreto de la familia (que ciertamente se puede ajustar), sino en la propia visión de la familia como una institución divinamente ordenada para el nacimiento y la crianza de los hijos, y el crecimiento en santidad del esposo y la esposa. Aprendamos de la sabiduría del Papa Francisco en su discurso del Ángelus el Domingo de la Sagrada Familia en 2019.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días!

Y verdaderamente, hoy es un día hermoso... Hoy celebramos la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret. El término "santo" sitúa a esta familia en el ámbito de la santidad que es un don de Dios pero, al mismo tiempo, es la adhesión libre y responsable al plan de Dios. Este fue el caso de la familia de Nazaret: estaban totalmente disponibles a la voluntad de Dios.

¿Cómo no maravillarnos, por ejemplo, de la docilidad de María a la acción del Espíritu Santo que le pide que sea la madre del Mesías? Porque María, como toda joven de su tiempo, estaba a punto de realizar su proyecto de vida, es decir, casarse con José.

Pero cuando se da cuenta de que Dios la llama a una misión particular, no duda en proclamarse su "sierva" (cf. *Lc 1, 38*). Jesús exaltará su grandeza no tanto por su papel de madre, sino por su obediencia a Dios. Jesús dijo: "Bienaventurados más bien los que oyen la palabra de Dios y la guardan" (*Lc 11,28*), como María. Y cuando no comprende del todo los acontecimientos que la involucran, María medita en silencio, reflexiona y adora la iniciativa divina. Su presencia al pie de la cruz consagra esta total disposición.

Entonces, con respecto a José, el Evangelio no nos da una sola palabra: no habla, sino que actúa, obedeciendo. Es el hombre del silencio, el hombre de la obediencia.

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy (cf. *Mt 2, 13-15, 19-23*) recuerda tres veces esta obediencia del justo José, refiriéndose a la huida a Egipto y al regreso a la tierra de Israel. Bajo la guía de Dios, representada por el ángel, José aleja a su familia de las amenazas de Herodes y los salva. La Sagrada Familia es, pues, solidaria con todas las familias del mundo forzadas al exilio, solidaria con todos aquellos que se ven obligados a abandonar su propia tierra debido a la represión, la violencia y la guerra.

Finalmente, la tercera persona de la Sagrada Familia, Jesús. Él es la voluntad del Padre: en Él, dice san Pablo, no hubo "sí" ni "no", sino sólo "sí" (cf. *2 Co 1, 19*). Y esto se manifiesta en muchos momentos de su vida terrenal. Por ejemplo, el episodio en el templo en el que respondió a los angustiados padres que lo buscaban: "¿No sabían que debo estar en la casa de mi Padre?" (*Lc 2, 49*); Su repetición continua: "Mi alimento es hacer la voluntad del que me envió y cumplir su obra" (*Jn 4, 34*); Su oración en el olivar: "Padre mío, si esto no puede pasar sin que yo lo beba, hágase tu voluntad" (*Mt 26, 42*). Todos estos eventos son la perfecta realización de las mismas palabras de Cristo que dice: "Sacrificios y ofrendas no has deseado [...] Entonces dije: 'He aquí, oh Dios, he venido para hacer tu voluntad, como está escrito de en el rollo del libro'" (*Hebreos 10: 5-7; Salmo 40: 7-9*).

María, José, Jesús: la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret que representa una respuesta coral a la voluntad del Padre: los tres miembros de esta familia se ayudan recíprocamente para descubrir el proyecto de Dios. Rezaron, trabajaron, se comunicaron. Y me pregunto: tú, en tu familia, ¿sabes comunicarte o eres como esos niños en la mesa, cada uno con su teléfono móvil, mientras están charlando? En esa mesa parece haber un silencio como si estuvieran en misa... Pero no se comunican entre ellos. Debemos reanudar el diálogo en la familia: padres, hijos, abuelos y hermanos deben comunicarse entre sí ... Esta es la tarea de hoy, justo en el día de la Sagrada Familia. Que la Sagrada Familia sea un modelo para nuestras familias, para que padres e hijos se apoyen mutuamente en la adhesión al Evangelio, base de la santidad de la familia.

Encomendamos a María, "Reina de la Familia", todas las familias del mundo, especialmente las que sufren o están en peligro, e invoquemos sobre ellas su protección materna.
