From Your Pastor's Heart

Dear parishioners and friends of our parish,

Greetings and Blessings to each of you from Assisi, the City of Peace.

As you read this letter, I will be concluding my five-day canonical Retreat in Assisi, one of my favorite places for doing the spiritual exercises required of priests every year. I have been here many times in the past. This year, however, the Retreat took on a particularly unique meaning to me because I am now a pastor. The faces of many of you, as well as the needs and concerns of our parish, were pretty much always on my mind as I prayed, reflected and discerned the Lord's will during the much-needed rest, far from the hustle and bustle of our city.

Having spent most of my days in the quiet and tranquil environment of the Franciscan Monastery here, I felt rested and renewed, physically and spiritually. This short time away has done me much good, as it brought many things that have happened in the last few months of my life into focus. I believe that, in the end, I have gained a deeper sense of mission and a greater motivation for pastoral service among you.

As I attended various functions at the Vatican this past week, I had the opportunity to meet some really dedicated priests and religious sisters who serve as missionaries in different parts of the world. They each had a fascinating story to tell, and their heroic witness inspired me. Most of them have felt a deep sense of mission and was motivated by it to leave behind their own family and homeland in order to serve the poor and the most vulnerable people in foreign lands. Some even faced unspeakable dangers as they minister in extreme poverty conditions or under an oppressive and hostile political regime. These men and women all have something in common: they are filled with gratitude. They see God's blessings everywhere, and they are enthusiastic about sharing with others even the least of those blessings.

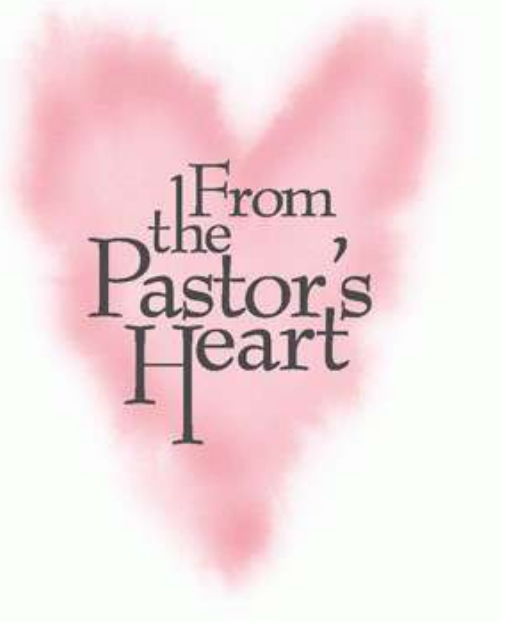
This weekend, in Rome and throughout the world, the Church observes World Mission Sunday. Through this letter, I wish to encourage the fullest participation of our parish, and to ask each of you to support the World Mission Sunday collection at Mass. Each year at this time, we are called to focus our attention on the great needs of the Church beyond our parish and our diocese. As I met His Holiness Pope Francis at the Vatican this past week, I was reminded of the Scriptural theme that he has chosen for this year's Mission Sunday, "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). The Holy Father reminds all of us of our responsibility to participate in the missionary work of the universal Church. In times of tragedy, natural disaster, war, and persecution, many people look to the Church and her missionaries for help and hope. World Mission Sunday celebrates our unity as a human family and provides an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of our Church among the suffering and the poor. In a real way, your contributions today will help someone in need see the merciful face of God.

My own presence in Rome these days is also seen as a sign of that special Catholic unity and universality that we all share in. The Holy Father and the various Superiors at the Holy See were delighted to learn about our parish and what we are doing to keep Christ's mission alive within our multi-cultural community. They assured me of their prayers for us and for our good works. In that spirit of spiritual closeness, I wish to end my letter with a promise to pray for you and your families in the Mass that I will celebrate this Tuesday morning at the Tomb of Saint John Paul II in St. Peter's Basilica, before my return to New York that same day.

Del Corazon de Su Pastor

Queridos feligreses y amigos de nuestra parroquia,

Saludos y bendiciones para cada uno de ustedes desde Asís, la Ciudad de la Paz.

Mientras leen esta carta, terminaré mi Retiro canónico de cinco días en Asís, uno de mis lugares favoritos para hacer los ejercicios espirituales requeridos por los sacerdotes cada año. He estado aquí muchas veces en el pasado. Este año, sin embargo, el Retiro adquirió un significado particularmente único para mí porque ahora soy pastor. Los rostros de muchos de ustedes, así como las necesidades y preocupaciones de nuestra parroquia, estuvieron casi siempre en mi mente mientras oraba, reflejaba y discernía la voluntad del Señor durante el descanso tan necesario, lejos del ajetreo y el bullicio de nuestra ciudad.



Habiendo pasado la mayor parte de mis días en el ambiente tranquilo y apacible del Monasterio Franciscano aquí, me sentí descansado y renovado, física y espiritualmente. Este breve tiempo fuera me ha servido de mucho, ya que me ha ayudado a enfocar muchas cosas que han sucedido en los últimos meses de mi vida. Creo que, al final, he ganado un sentido de misión más profundo y una mayor motivación para el servicio pastoral entre ustedes.

Mientras asistía a varias funciones en el Vaticano la semana pasada, tuve la oportunidad de conocer a algunos sacerdotes y religiosas realmente dedicados que sirven como misioneros en diferentes partes del mundo. Cada uno de ellos tenía una historia fascinante que contar, y su heroico testimonio me inspiró. La mayoría de ellos ha tenido un profundo sentido de misión y fue motivado por ella para dejar atrás su propia familia y su patria para servir a los pobres y las personas más vulnerables en tierras extranjeras. Algunos incluso enfrentaron peligros indescriptibles mientras ministran en condiciones de pobreza extrema o bajo un régimen político opresivo y hostil. Todos estos hombres y mujeres tienen algo en común: están llenos de gratitud. Ven las bendiciones de Dios en todas partes y les entusiasma compartir con los demás, incluso la más pequeña de esas bendiciones.

Este fin de semana, en Roma y en todo el mundo, la Iglesia observa el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. A través de esta carta, deseo alentar la participación más plena de nuestra parroquia, y pedirles a cada uno de ustedes que apoyen la colecta del Domingo Mundial de las Misiones en la Misa. Cada año en este momento, estamos llamados a enfocar nuestra atención en las grandes necesidades de la Iglesia. Iglesia más allá de nuestra parroquia y nuestra diócesis. Cuando me reuní con Su Santidad el Papa Francisco en el Vaticano la semana pasada, recordé el tema bíblico que ha elegido para el Domingo de las Misiones de este año: "No podemos dejar de hablar de lo que hemos visto y oído" (Hechos 4:20). El Santo Padre nos recuerda a todos nuestra responsabilidad de participar en la obra misionera de la Iglesia universal. En tiempos de tragedia, desastre natural, guerra y persecución, muchas personas buscan ayuda y esperanza en la Iglesia y sus misioneros. El Domingo Mundial de las Misiones celebra nuestra unidad como familia humana y brinda la oportunidad de apoyar la presencia vivificante de nuestra Iglesia entre los que sufren y los pobres. De manera real, sus contribuciones de hoy ayudarán a alguien necesitado a ver el rostro misericordioso de Dios.

Mi propia presencia en Roma en estos días también se ve como un signo de esa unidad y universalidad católica especial que todos compartimos. El Santo Padre y los distintos Superiores de la Santa Sede estuvieron encantados de conocer nuestra parroquia y lo que estamos haciendo para mantener viva la misión de Cristo dentro de nuestra comunidad multicultural. Me aseguraron sus oraciones por nosotros y por nuestras buenas obras. En ese espíritu de cercanía espiritual, deseo terminar mi carta con la promesa de rezar por ustedes y sus familias en la Misa que celebraré este martes por la mañana en la Tumba de San Juan Pablo II en la Basílica de San Pedro, antes de mi regreso a Nueva York ese mismo día.
