REMEMBERING OUR BELOVED DECEASED

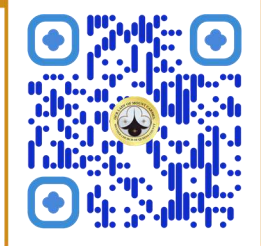

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we gather for the Holy Eucharist on this 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, our Scripture readings shine a light on our roles and responsibilities within our faith community.

The Prophet Ezekiel paints a picture of our duty as the “watchmen” of our community (Ez 33:7-9). This role compels us to be more than passive recipients of God’s grace. Instead, we are to actively become stewards of His love, consistently guiding, supporting, and nurturing one another. In the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul underscores this sentiment, stating that our only debt to one another should be love, for “love fulfills the law” (Rom 13:8-10).

Today’s passage from the Gospel of Matthew deepens our understanding of our communal obligations, highlighting the essence of fraternal correction and the power of communal prayer (Mt 18:15-20). This reinforces the spirit of our Church community, where each day brings an opportunity to watch over one another through acts of love and prayer. In our parish, every individual’s spiritual journey adds to our collective story. We must remember that our individual paths, regardless of how personal they may seem, contribute to the broader tapestry of our ecclesial community.

With this sense of shared journey in mind, I reflect on the closing of the summer season and its transitions. As our younger members head back to school, I hope their hearts are brimming with memories of a rejuvenating summer, characterized by deepening relationships with family, friends, and, most importantly, God. I extend a special blessing to our children and youth who embark on a new chapter in our Religious Education Program and Youth Ministry. These vital endeavors are not just about preparing them for the Sacraments but guiding them towards a life of maturity rooted in Christ. Our Religious Education Coordinator Nelly Gutierrez and our team of dedicated catechists and volunteers, together with our Youth Ministers Dayonel Mejina and Yolanda Lazo, truly embody the spirit of the watchmen, shepherding our youth with unwavering love.

Today’s Responsorial Psalm strikes a chord within our hearts: *“If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts”* (Ps 95:1-2). This sentiment comes to mind when I reflect upon the seminarians closely linked to our parish community, who are now standing at pivotal junctures in their spiritual journey: newly ordained Deacon Randy Nguyen, native son of our parish; John Ngo, Peter Nguyen, and Joseph Tran, who, though not originally from our parish, have been embraced by us and hold a special place in our community. Deacon Randy is now back at St. Vincent’s Seminary in Latrobe, Pennsylvania for his last year of priestly formation. John is now assigned to his Pastoral Year at Most Precious Blood Parish in Brooklyn, while Peter and Joseph are undertaking theological studies at St. Andrew’s Seminary in Seton Hall University, New Jersey. The commitment of these young men shows the depth of their faith and underscores the significance of community support. As they move forward in their spiritual paths, it’s vital for us to continually stand by them, because they are not just embarking on this journey for themselves, but for the entire Church community who will benefit from their ministry. Rest assured, we will periodically see them during their breaks, bearing witness to their growth and allowing us to participate in their vocation journey firsthand.

With summer now behind us, I urge each of you to embrace the upcoming season as a fresh opportunity to deepen our bond with the Lord. This is an opportunity for active participation in the life of our parish, to be a part of the “two or three” where Christ promises His presence.

Estimados hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Al reunirnos para la Santa Eucaristía este 23er Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, las lecturas bíblicas iluminan nuestros papeles y responsabilidades dentro de nuestra comunidad de fe.

AFTER A CIVIL DIVORCE, IS A CATHOLIC OBLIGATED TO PURSUE AN ANNULMENT?

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.

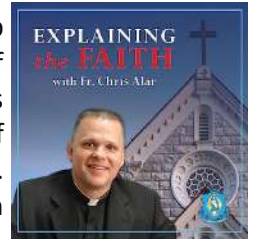

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What are you supposed to do about the bad behavior of the people around you? You know who I'm talking about. That family member, friend, coworker, or acquaintance who is quite immoral. On this front there are two lively options in our culture: bash the person to others (probably online) or pretend everything's fine. The former damages the person. The latter ignores reality. What to do?

Jesus' strategy in the Gospel of Matthew is as wise as it is difficult: go directly to the person, and then gradually expand the circle of intervention. Simple, often effective, and hard. But what we often miss is the context of the Lord's strategy, "If your *brother* sins against *you*..." Notice the italicized words. Is the person in a Christian familial bond with *you*? And was the action in question against *you*? If so, proceed with the plan. Fine. But how often we fret over the sins of those who either aren't our spiritual siblings or have done nothing directly to us. This is not an invitation to ignore injustice in the world. Rather, we should build bonds of fraternal love, and carefully discern when and how others' sins are indeed our concern. Sometimes they are. Other times frequently, perhaps they simply are not.

As summer winds down and the return to a hectic pace awaits, you may want to take some time to check the legal documents related to your home.

Considering NYC's real estate prices, your home may be your most valuable asset. Home title and related documents must be in order to make sure you and your family are protected.

For example, is the title to your house in your individual name or in joint name with someone else? Are you the surviving joint tenant of the property? If you paid off your mortgage, was the Satisfaction of Mortgage properly recorded? Are all your real estate taxes paid currently? Many people assume their real estate documents are in order, but sometimes there are unexpected difficulties which arise because of life events affecting the existing documentation.

Taking the time to check does not take long and is important to make sure your home is secure.

Another good checkup is whether you have a valid Durable Power of Attorney which designates someone to act on your behalf in the event you incur a disability.

Remember, a disability can be anything from a broken arm affecting your ability to sign your name to a more serious disability from a medical condition such as a stroke. Again, over time and through some of life's circumstances, it is important to have a trusted person designated by you in place to act for you. It only takes a brief time to do the review to make sure you are protected.

A little summertime review provides additional peace of mind for an enjoyable summer season.

A medida que el verano termina y le espera el regreso a un ritmo agitado, es posible que desee tomarse un tiempo para revisar los documentos legales relacionados con su hogar.

Teniendo en cuenta los precios inmobiliarios de la ciudad de Nueva York, su casa puede ser su activo más valioso. El título de la vivienda y los documentos relacionados deben ser para garantizar que usted y su familia estén protegidos.

Por ejemplo, ¿el título de su casa está a su nombre individual o a nombre conjunto con otra persona? ¿Es usted el copropietario sobreviviente de la propiedad? Si canceló su hipoteca, ¿se registró correctamente la Satisfacción de la Hipoteca? ¿Están todos sus impuestos inmobiliarios pagados actualmente? Muchas personas asumen que sus documentos inmobiliarios están en orden, pero a veces surgen dificultades inesperadas debido a acontecimientos de la vida que afectan la documentación existente.

Tomarse el tiempo para verificar no toma mucho tiempo y es importante para asegurarse de que su hogar esté seguro.

Otro buen control es si tiene un poder notarial duradero válido que designe a alguien para actuar en su nombre en caso de que incurra en una discapacidad.

Recuerde, una discapacidad puede ser cualquier cosa, desde un brazo roto que afecte su capacidad para firmar con su nombre hasta una discapacidad más grave derivada de una afección médica como un derrame cerebral. Nuevamente, con el tiempo y a través de algunas circunstancias de la vida, es importante contar con una persona de confianza designada por usted para que actúe en su nombre. Sólo toma un breve tiempo realizar la revisión para asegurarse de que está protegido.

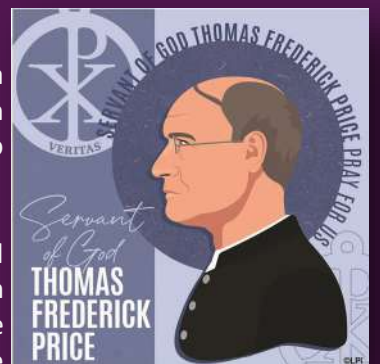
