Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we gather on this Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Scriptures from today's Mass deliver a profound message of hope, resonating deeply with my own journey through life's tempests and the unwavering presence of God.

Growing up amidst the chaos of the Vietnam War, facing its traumatic aftermath, and resettling in the United States as a teenager, I have encountered many hardships that tested my faith. As your priest, I am privileged to accompany you through your own trials—be it poverty, illness, distress, or other challenges. Daily, people in profound need seek solace and hope within our Church, and I find myself deeply engaged, striving to offer compassion and empathy, even amidst my own burdens.

Yet, amid these personal and communal challenges, the truth that only God can calm life's storms remains evident. Our faith, tested in moments of vulnerability, emerges stronger. Like the disciples on the Sea of Galilee, panicked amidst a violent storm, I too have felt the Lord's reassuring presence when most needed. Jesus' calming presence reminds us that even amidst seemingly insurmountable problems, He is with us—often in quiet whispers, extended hands, promises of prayer, or gestures of support.

This Sunday's Gospel illuminates our human experience of navigating stormy times—a call to lean on Christ not only in crises but in every moment of our lives. Reflect on your own experiences and recognize where Christ has been present. Recall those instances when you reached out in panic, feeling His calming presence just as despair seemed to take hold. Jesus' calming of the turbulent sea is not just symbolic; it's a promise of His control over life's chaos, a lesson that even when our faith wavers, His immediate response to our cries assures us of His guidance to safety.

Our hope amidst life's storms lies in trusting Jesus, listening attentively for His gentle whisper, assured that He is always near. Christ is our anchor, and our faith in Him, alongside the love and support of our Church community, will guide us through any tempest.

I am filled with profound gratitude to God that, despite the storms I've faced, none have dimmed my positive outlook on life or my joyful spirit. On the contrary, these trials have strengthened my faith that Christ journeys with me, guiding me through tumultuous waters.

In closing, I wish to share with you the joyous news that I recently had the privilege to concelebrate the Mass of Thanksgiving with newly ordained Father Joseph V. Nguyen "JV" in North Vietnam. It was a celebration marked by profound joy and moving testimonies of faith, reminding us of the enduring power of God's presence in our lives. Like me, this young priest has been through so many hardships in life, but they have only served to strengthen his religious commitment. His story is an inspiring illustration of Jesus' transforming power in our lives, showing us that even amidst life's greatest challenges, God's grace sustains and empowers us.

Additionally, having spent a few days in Hanoi, North Vietnam, I will now journey to Saigon, South Vietnam, to be present at my spiritual son's Mass of Thanksgiving, Father Joseph C. Le. This part of the trip allows me to visit my former parish where I was born and raised, and to spend time with my extended family. Rest assured that I will always remember you at the Altar each day.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Al reunirnos en este Duodécimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, las Escrituras de la Misa de hoy nos entregan un mensaje profundo de esperanza, que resuena profundamente con mi propio camino a través de las tempestades de la vida y la presencia constante de Dios.

Crecí en medio del caos de la Guerra de Vietnam, enfrentando sus traumáticas secuelas y reasentándome en Estados Unidos siendo adolescente, he enfrentado numerosas dificultades que pusieron a prueba mi fe. Como su sacerdote, tengo el privilegio de acompañarles en sus propias pruebas, ya sea pobreza, enfermedad, angustia u otros desafíos. A diario, personas con grandes necesidades buscan consuelo y esperanza en nuestra Iglesia, y me encuentro profundamente comprometido, esforzándome por ofrecer compasión y empatía, aún en medio de mis propias cargas.

Sin embargo, en medio de estos desafíos personales y comunitarios, la verdad de que solo Dios puede calmar las tormentas de la vida permanece evidente. Nuestra fe, probada en momentos de vulnerabilidad, emerge más fuerte. Como los discípulos en el Mar de Galilea, atemorizados en medio de una violenta tormenta, yo también he sentido la presencia tranquilizadora del Señor cuando más lo necesitaba. La presencia calmante de Jesús nos recuerda que incluso en medio de problemas aparentemente insuperables, Él está con nosotros, a menudo en susurros suaves, manos extendidas, promesas de oración o gestos de apoyo.

El Evangelio de este Domingo ilumina nuestra experiencia humana de navegar tiempos tormentosos: un llamado a apoyarnos en Cristo no solo en crisis, sino en cada momento de nuestras vidas. Reflexionen sobre sus propias experiencias y reconozcan dónde ha estado presente Cristo. Recuerden aquellos momentos en que buscaron desesperadamente, sintiendo Su presencia tranquilizadora justo cuando el desespero parecía apoderarse. La calma de Jesús sobre el mar turbulento no es solo simbólica; es una promesa de Su control sobre el caos de la vida, una lección de que incluso cuando nuestra fe vacila, Su respuesta inmediata a nuestros clamores nos asegura Su guía hacia la seguridad.

Nuestra esperanza en medio de las tormentas de la vida radica en confiar en Jesús, escuchando atentamente Su suave susurro, seguros de que Él siempre está cerca. Cristo es nuestro ancla, y nuestra fe en Él, junto con el amor y apoyo de nuestra comunidad eclesial, nos guiará a través de cualquier tempestad.

Estoy lleno de profunda gratitud hacia Dios porque, a pesar de las tormentas que he enfrentado, ninguna ha oscurecido mi visión positiva de la vida ni mi espíritu alegre. Por el contrario, estas pruebas han fortalecido mi fe de que Cristo camina conmigo, guiándome a través de aguas tumultuosas.

Para concluir, deseo compartirles la buena noticia de que recientemente tuve el privilegio de concelebrar la Misa de Acción de Gracias con el recién ordenado Padre Joseph V. Nguyen "JV" en el Norte de Vietnam. Fue una celebración marcada por una alegría profunda y conmovedores testimonios de fe, que nos recuerdan el poder perdurable de la presencia de Dios en nuestras vidas. Al igual que yo, este joven sacerdote ha enfrentado muchas dificultades en la vida, pero solo han servido para fortalecer su compromiso religioso. Su historia es una inspiradora ilustración del poder transformador de Jesús en nuestras vidas, mostrándonos que incluso en medio de los mayores desafíos de la vida, la gracia de Dios nos sostiene y fortalece.

Además, después de pasar unos días en Hanói, Vietnam del Norte, ahora viajaré a Saigón, Vietnam del Sur, para estar presente en la Misa de Acción de Gracias de mi hijo espiritual, el Padre Joseph C. Le. Esta parte del viaje me permite visitar mi antigua parroquia donde nací y crecí, y pasar tiempo con mi familia extendida. Tengan la seguridad de que siempre los recordaré en el Altar cada día.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Right now, you and I are only worried about one of only two things: wind or water. Bear with me. This week we hear the account of the terrified disciples waking Jesus in a sea-storm. He chastises them for their lack of faith, and then, "rebuking the wind, he said to the sea, 'Quiet, be still!'" He rebukes the wind and stills the water. In the Bible wind and water represent the two most fundamental poles of our experience of creation. Wind means heaven, spirit, that which gives identity, unity, order, light Water stands for earth, variation, potential, that which can be drawn into identity, darkness, chaos. Too much "wind is when things get way too rigid, abstract and ideological when we face oppressive leaders and

tyrants, when we get addicted to our own way of doing things, when our attention is too narrowly focused on one thing. Too much "water" is excessive novelty, passivity, indifference, and chaos when our attention is too broadly diffused on many things, when things seem to be crumbling without direction into the dark abyss. We know both terrifying experiences all too well. The point of the miracle is that God in Christ is the One who brings final cosmic harmony between these two vital but threatening forces. He ultimately does so from the wood of the cross, when he breathes forth the wind of his spirit and pours forth the water from his side to establish a new creation, filled with harmonious peace. When the wind and water are out of control, trust him.

THE PERFECT STORM

I am writing this on a Saturday morning. Saturdays are my writing days, when my husband takes over the kids and the house and I disappear into the office with an enormous cup of coffee and noise-canceling headphones. Saturdays are sacred if work can be called sacred. But Saturday morning is also the only time I'm able to consistently get to confession. Every other time the sacrament is offered in my area during the week, I seem to have unavoidable commitments - but on Saturday morning, all I have is work, and how can I let work come before a sacrament, as much as I might secretly want to? I've spent a good deal of time being bitter about this, because it's just not convenient, having to carve out time from work to run to the other side of town, especially when I get there and there's a line. I sit there in the sanctuary, waiting my turn, checking the clock, stewing, fretting. Obsessing over forgetting one of my sins. Thinking of how much work I have when

I get home. Saturday mornings: a perfect storm, I sometimes call it in my head. I forge ahead, though. I've never gotten up and dashed back to my desk. I make it into the confessional and I stammer out my pathetic little list and receive absolution. Then I go before the tabernacle to perform my penance. It's while I am kneeling there that it happens. Always, God awakens, and he cries into the depths of my heart: "Quiet! Be still! Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" After teaching all day by the shore of the sea, Jesus asks his disciples to remove him from the crowds. He wants to escape the noise, the clamor, the disquiet. But the clamor follows him, because the world is full of it. Storms crop up wherever we go. Jesus sleeps through the storm, because he understands what the disciples do not: the storms of the world cannot hurt us. They are only so much noise. "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" - Mark 4:41
