DIGGING DEEPER INTO SUNDAY'S READINGS

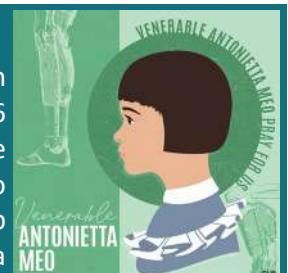
First Reading: Our wisdom writer teaches us that God did not create death, rather, death entered the world from the envy of the devil. How should a Christian think about death?

FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Spiritual writers speak of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as "the Mass held in contemplation." As a way of encouraging devotion to the Eucharist, we invite all parishioners to come and spend some time before the Real Presence of the Lord on **Friday, July 5th, 2024**. Exposition and Adoration will take place right after the 8:00am Mass and will conclude with Solemn Benediction before the start of the 12 Noon Mass.

THE TOUCH OF CHRIST

For a long time, I didn't understand why the virtual Masses of the pandemic were so wearisome to me. Theoretically, shouldn't it be a tired mother's dream, fulfilling her Sunday obligation from the couch, not having to worry how much noise the kids are making? But it wasn't. Seeing Mass without experiencing it left me hungry. It left me starving. Then a wise priest explained it to me. "Watching virtual Mass is like taking a virtual shower," he said. Grace might not be something we can see with our eyes, but it is very much something that is transmitted physically. Jesus has a human body for a reason. He needs to touch people. We see that nowhere more clearly than in this Gospel. The crowds are pressing on him, everyone trying to get close, everyone trying to share his space. The hemorrhaging woman claws her way through, desperate to make physical contact with him, any part of him, even his cloak. The synagogue official begs Jesus to

come and "lay hands" on his daughter, knowing that this is the only way for her to survive. He doesn't ask for Jesus' good thoughts or approving gaze. He knows that isn't what he needs. In the Gospels, Jesus saves people chiefly through his own touch because he wants to show us you and me, sitting in the pews - something very important about how we are saved But where do you and I find the touch of Jesus Christ? Where do you and I find salvation? It's in the water flowing over the infant's forehead. It's in the Host dissolving on our tongues. It's in the oil that is pressed to the skin of the confirmand, the dying man, and the brand-new priest. It's in the embrace of the newly married couple. It's in the extended hand of the priest as he says, "Your sins are forgiven." It's still here, two thousand years later. It's still waiting for us to reach out and grasp it. "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." - Mark 5:28

Dear brothers and sisters,

As we enter the Thirteenth Week in Ordinary Time, our hearts are drawn to reflect on the profound gifts of life and healing that God has bestowed upon us. The Scripture readings this Sunday remind us of God's intention for us to live in health, both in body and soul, and to share in His eternal life through Christ's victory over death.

The Book of Wisdom teaches us that God is the source of life and health, contrasting with the forces of evil that bring illness and death. Through Jesus Christ, as celebrated in Psalm 30, we are rescued and forgiven, called to live fully in His grace. St. Paul's call to the Corinthians echoes this generosity, urging us to show compassion to those in need, as Christ showed compassion through his healing miracles recounted in the Gospel.

In my current travels through Vietnam, I have witnessed the extraordinary growth of the Church here through numerous conversions and an increase in priestly and religious vocations. This wonderful development is a testament to the transformative power of faith and the impact of the Church's ministries in bringing hope and healing to the marginalized and poor. Even in a developing country facing many challenges, including the care for the elderly, disabled, orphans, and the sick with limited means, the Church shines brightly. Numerous services and compassionate Catholic individuals inspire the whole society by their selfless dedication and love. The Church's works of mercy in Vietnam are praiseworthy, invoking deep respect even among those who do not share our faith.

However, closer to home, our parish has faced a troubling incident. A deeply troubled woman, exhibiting signs of severe mental distress, has repeatedly come to disrupt our Sunday Masses and insulted our priests and parishioners with loud and profane outbursts. Her sacrilegious actions, particularly desecrating the Eucharist and insulting the Blessed Mother, have deeply saddened and disturbed many of us. We have notified the police each time, but unfortunately, she has left by the time they arrived. We are advised to remain vigilant and report any sightings of her immediately to 911. It is crucial that if she disrupts our services, we document these incidents with photos or videos as evidence under New York Penal Law Section 240.21, which treats a disruption to any religious service as a Class A misdemeanor.

In light of these challenges, it is crucial to maintain compassion for those facing mental distress while also safeguarding our sacred beliefs. Despite our efforts to extend courtesy to the woman, she has physically assaulted me twice within the sanctuary, in full view of parishioners. In addition to these assaults, she has directed verbal insults and violent threats, and has even desecrated the hosts prepared for Mass, causing great distress to our ministers. These actions seem to be motivated by malevolent intent, perhaps even influenced by forces beyond mere human behavior.

Given these troubling events in our neighborhood, it is imperative for all of us to remain vigilant and united in protecting our community and sacred spaces. We must uphold an environment where everyone can worship in peace and safety. Your cooperation and watchfulness are greatly appreciated as we navigate through this challenging situation together.

In the midst of this, I urge everyone to please keep this mentally troubled woman in your prayers. Surely, the Lord desires her to experience good health and wholeness, liberated from whatever troubles her from within. Let us pray for her deliverance and healing. At the same time, let us uphold one another in prayer, seeking God's wisdom and strength to respond with compassion and resolve.

May God bless each of you abundantly, protect our parish community, and guide us in extending Christ's healing presence to all in need.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Al comenzar la Decimotercera Semana del Tiempo Ordinario, nuestros corazones se inclinan a reflexionar sobre los profundos dones de vida y sanación que Dios nos ha otorgado. Las lecturas de este domingo nos recuerdan la intención de Dios para que vivamos en salud, tanto en cuerpo como en alma, y compartamos su vida eterna a través de la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte.

El Libro de la Sabiduría nos enseña que Dios es la fuente de vida y salud, contrastando con las fuerzas del mal que traen enfermedad y muerte. A través de Jesucristo, como se celebra en el Salmo 30, somos rescatados y perdonados, llamados a vivir plenamente en su gracia. El llamado de San Pablo a los Corintios refleja esta generosidad, exhortándonos a mostrar compasión por los necesitados, como Cristo mostró compasión a través de sus milagros sanadores narrados en el Evangelio.

En mis viajes actuales por Vietnam, he sido testigo del extraordinario crecimiento de la Iglesia aquí, con numerosas conversiones y un aumento en las vocaciones sacerdotales y religiosas. Este maravilloso desarrollo es un testimonio del poder transformador de la fe y el impacto de los ministerios de la Iglesia al llevar esperanza y sanación a los marginados y pobres. Incluso en un país en desarrollo enfrentando muchos desafíos, incluido el cuidado de los ancianos, discapacitados, huérfanos y enfermos con recursos limitados, la Iglesia brilla con luz propia. Numerosos servicios e individuos católicos compasivos inspiran a toda la sociedad con su dedicación y amor desinteresados, evocando profundo respeto incluso entre aquellos que no comparten nuestra fe.

Sin embargo, más cerca de casa, nuestra parroquia ha enfrentado un incidente preocupante. Una mujer profundamente perturbada, exhibiendo signos de angustia mental severa, ha venido repetidamente a perturbar nuestras Misas dominicales e insultar a nuestros sacerdotes y feligreses con estallidos ruidosos y profanos. Sus acciones sacrílegas, especialmente la profanación de la Eucaristía y los insultos a la Santísima Madre, nos han entristecido y perturbado profundamente a muchos de nosotros. Hemos notificado a la policía en cada ocasión, pero lamentablemente, ella se marcha antes de que ellos lleguen. Se nos aconseja mantenernos vigilantes y reportar cualquier avistamiento de ella inmediatamente al 911. Es crucial que, si interrumpe nuestros servicios, documentemos estos incidentes con fotos o videos como evidencia según la Sección 240.21 de la Ley Penal de Nueva York, que trata la interrupción de cualquier servicio religioso como un delito menor de Clase A.

En vista de estos desafíos, es crucial mantener la compasión por aquellos que enfrentan angustia mental al tiempo que salvaguardamos nuestras creencias sagradas. A pesar de nuestros esfuerzos por mostrar cortesía a la mujer, ella me ha agredido físicamente dos veces dentro del santuario, a la vista de los feligreses. Además de estas agresiones, ha proferido insultos y amenazas violentas, e incluso ha profanado las hostias preparadas para la Misa, causando gran angustia a nuestros ministros. Estas acciones parecen estar motivadas por una intención malévola, quizás influenciada por fuerzas más allá del simple comportamiento humano.

Ante estos eventos preocupantes en nuestro vecindario, es imperativo que todos permanezcamos vigilantes y unidos para proteger nuestra comunidad y nuestros espacios sagrados. Debemos mantener un ambiente donde todos puedan adorar en paz y seguridad. Agradecemos enormemente su cooperación y vigilancia.

En medio de esto, les insto a todos a mantener a esta mujer en sus oraciones. Seguramente, el Señor desea que experimente buena salud y plenitud, liberada de cualquier problema que la atormenta desde dentro. Oremos por su liberación y sanación. Al mismo tiempo, mantengámonos unidos en la oración, buscando la sabiduría y la fortaleza de Dios para responder con compasión y determinación.

Que Dios los bendiga abundantemente, proteja a nuestra comunidad parroquial y nos guíe para extender la presencia sanadora de Cristo a todos los necesitados.

Espero verlos nuevamente el próximo fin de semana.

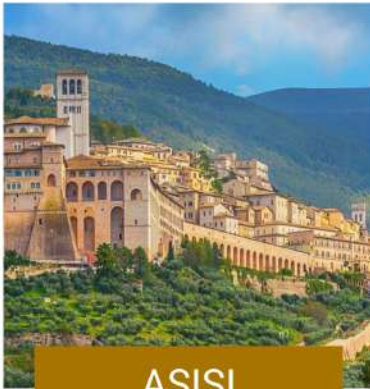

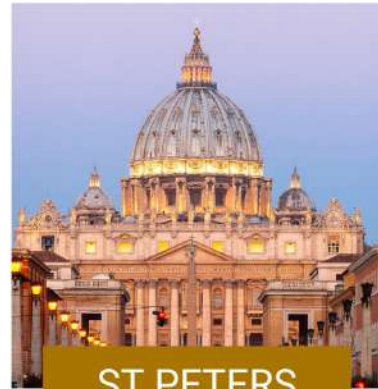
